I had to get to work and put 3 hours in before our ride.

Hour by hour I was watching the weather and just as soon as the sun came out another cloud would cover the warming rays.

By 11.30 there was no sign of rain and yes it had warmed up a little.

Joyce, Paul, Sonya and I geared up and headed off to the BP to meet up with everyone else.
